## 3. AREA OF RESEARCH, WORK: Professor Dr. Jennifer Gardner:

- Curator of the Waite Arboretum since 1986.
- Curator of the Waite Conservation Reserve.
- Curator of the Urrbrae House Historic Precinct

**Douglas Gardner:** Douglas's interest in the Waite Campus has been has a Waite Arboretum supporter and volunteer for over thirty years.

 His support and volunteer work relating to the Waite Arboretum has been with countless hours off and on site in tree data collection and supporting roles. He continues to support the Waite Arboretum.

## 4. RESEARCH SPECIALITY - SPECIAL FEATURES

Dr. Jennifer Gardner: The Waite Arboretum.

Gardner's first Arboretum Report "in 1988 – 1989 carries the pregnant suggestions of more experimental work, a survey of the collection, and the establishment of an electronic database" (Gardner and Symon, 2004).

A third phase (since 1928) in the development of the Waite Arboretum began under Jennifer Gardner in 1986 which included:

- The Arboretum was to be seen as a "working collection of trees".
- There were developments of a self guided walk and trail guide.
- There was an increase in interpretative signage.
- The friends of the Waite Arboretum (FWA) was formed and is still operating in 2016.
- The FWA were recruiting and training volunteers.
- The Arboretum was strongly promoting its educational role and community program outreach.
- Presentation to community groups and booked tours by U3A and many other interested groups took place.
- Free guided tours were in place.
- The Arboretum was being actively promoted as a teaching tool for secondary and Tertiary education.
- The Arboretum was made available and be seen a research tool for many research areas: plant physiology, phytochemisty and chemotaxonomy to name just a few.
- Gardner requests in 1993 and 1994 was successful with a further 3ha being added to the Arboretum (Gardner and Symon, 2004).
- Jennifer Gardner and Daivd Lawry established TREENET which is a non-profit collaborative organisation which is still based at the Waite Arboretum with an aim of bringing together people who have 'an interest in the selection, production and establishment and care of street trees".

## In 2016 continuing the Third Phase and beyond

Many of the actions of the third phase quoting from the Gardner and Symon 2014 article can be seen today in 2016 in additional to further changes that have been developed and implemented. For example:

- Friends of the Waite Arboretum Inc. and the Friends of the Waite Conservation Reserve are still both active in promoting, raising funds and volunteering work in the field.
- In 2016 the Arboretum can be seen as increasing its appeal and its educational values and opportunity to all people in the community - in all ages - young families with pre-school children to senior citizens.
- Jennifer has initiated and embraced changing technology to enhance the appeal and benefits of the Arboretum to the community with the FWA Website, and the Waite Arboretum app.
- Jennifer attends and providing presentations on Arboretum matters in research education, publicity and promotional events forums.
- Jennifer continues to encourage and nurture volunteers in a number of her work responsibilities and promotes the values of their work and how they contribute financially (with volunteer labour) and socially to the University of Adelaide and the wider community.

### • Waite Conservation Reserve

- Jennifer's management of the Waite Conservation Reserve has included and continues to include surveying of plant and animals, seed collection, plant propagation, weed management / eradication, research, feral animal control and much more.
- **Urrbrae Historic House Precinct (**the gardens around Urrbrae House and the area parallel with Claremont Avenue).
- Jennifer' participation in the Precinct has included commissioning master plans landscape master plans, project management in the Twentieth Century, the Rose Garden, the Garden of Discovery, the Sensory Garden and many other areas of the Precinct.

#### Urrbrae House

Jennifer has developed a Botanical Collection Room that can be viewed in Urrbrae House.

Jennifer continues to be passionate and active in preserving the aims of the Peter Waite 1928 bequest.

"The purposes of the Arboretum are experimental i.e. to demonstrate and evaluate the suitability of a wide range of trees to the local environment, to provide a valuable resource for teaching, research and propagation and to provide an attractive and informative area for passive recreation" (text from the Friends of the Waite Arboretum Invitation to Membership Form, 2016).

**Douglas Gardner:** In the days before the use of GPS, Douglas gathered and recorded data on every tree in the Arboretum.

# 5. FURTHER INFORMATION - SOME WORDS OF HUMOUR, INTERESTING FACTS, ETC:

"Jennifer Gardner said that she first met David in 1959 when she did her Grade 7 project on the Waite Institute.

- David talked to her enthusiastically about the Arboretum. 27 years later, when she was appointed Curator of the Arboretum.
- David helped her find her feet and continued to share his knowledge, insights and ideas for the Arboretum until his last days.
- Jennifer says that there was only one area where their views differed.
- During the prolonged drought she installed drip irrigation to extend the life and promote the health of our heritage-listed Elm Avenue.
- David, with characteristic forthrightness said "Let them die!" as he visualised a unique and spectacular avenue of 70 dragon trees taking their place. That was David: always looking to the future" (Gardner 2012, pp.5-6).

In February 1986 Gardner submitted her "PhD thesis on buprestids or jewel beetles in the Department of Zoology at the University of Adelaide' (Zeitz, 2014, p.350).
