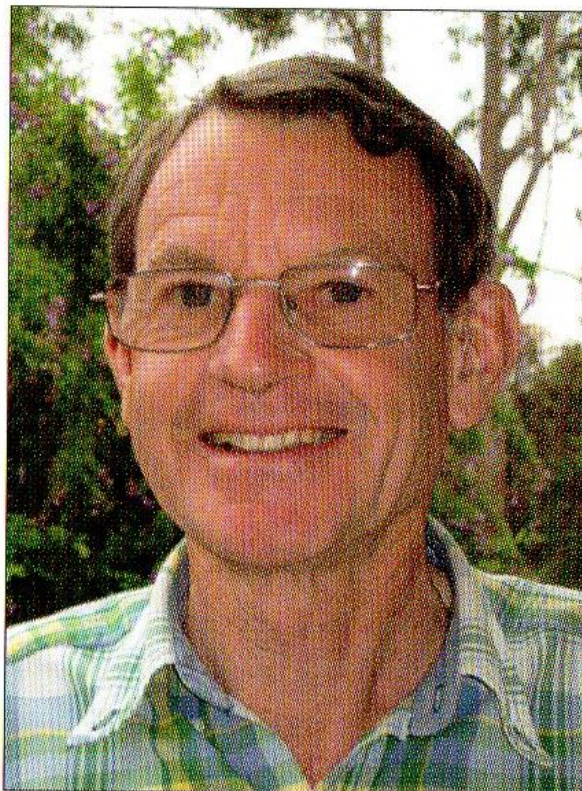

- 1. NAME - DOB – DOD:** Bryan Leslie Milligan 10 August 1938 – 17 October 2015
- Occupation:** “Assistant Farm Manager and later Manager of Research Services of Rural Services Department, ...” (Zeitz, 2014, p.115) Waite Agricultural Research Institute.
- Location:** Walk into the Arboretum from Walter Young Drive, entering through the small gate in on the left hand just past the palms and the cycads. The seat is facing south west.
- Nearby tree/plant species:** #107 cassia *Brewsteri* F. Muell. Cigar Cassia LEGUMINOSAE QLD. 1965

Bryan Milligan ‘running the farm’

“Bryan Milligan acknowledge the farm management were” “fairly flexible in the way we used our funds. We raised money from crops we grew on other properties and of course we raised money from sheep that we ran on the Waite Campus and other places as well, so we [had]... what we called or “sheep account”. We were able to use tah money inall sorts of ways. For example, at one stage we bought a new washing machine for the potting shed so they could wash all their pots automatically rather by hand. ... We were able to buy equipment for the gardens.” Zeitz (2014, p394).

Zeitz (2014, p394) writes of the Waite Farm staff which number about 20 people who were looking after the WARI *“grounds and gardens, including two orchards, the Arboretum, potting shed and glasshouses, and grass gardens. Their worked also covered the Waite Fields, the paddocks down below the Farm Office area and a mechanic’s workshop”*
